OBJECTIVE Using documentary evidence, locate and identify the burial location

of Ida Robertson/Robinson and any other pertinent information which may disclose her parentage. Determine Ida's parentage.

BACKGROUND SUMMARY Ida Robinson/Robertson married Andrew Fullum Weidenbacker and had 3 children including sons Andrew and Jack Weidenbacker. It is now known she died in 1921 while visiting son, Andrew. She was born in Tennessee 1871/1872 and was apparently orphaned, along with her brother and sister, by 1880. Her name appears both as Robinson and as Robertson, and her son Jack used both names (calling them as his mother's maiden name) when filling out forms.

RESTRICTIONS OR LIMITATIONS

Ongoing research and reporting, no travel. Repository closures due to COVID-19 limited availability of certain records.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS:

The research objective for this session has been partially met.

Ida Jane Robinson/Robertson was born in September 1871 or October 2, 1872 in Tennessee. It is unknown who her parents are. She is shown on the 1880 census with her much older siblings Henry R. Robertson and Mary Elizabeth Robertson in Nashville, Davidson, Tennessee.

In several directories for the Spokane region, when looking for the surname Robertson, there is a note to also look at Robinson and Roberson. Apparently, many were interchangeable at the time and each currently is correct, until I can determine her parentage and trace the lineage backwards.

I am looking at finding delayed birth records for Ida's siblings: Henry R. and Mary Elizabeth, both born in Tennessee. Hopefully one of her siblings will shine light on her parentage.

(<u>To make note about another Ida Weidenbacker</u>. There is also an additional person named "Ida Weidenbacker" living in Washington about the same time – however this is Ida Bell Hayden, prev. married to Arthur Savoy, and then she married Peter Weidenbacker and they lived in Seattle, King, Washington. No direct relation to this Ida. All records for the Ida we are researching are found in and around Spokane, not Seattle.)

She often worked as a clerk while living in Spokane for various companies. She was also known as a singer and a pianist.

Ida Robinson/Robertson Weidenbacker was visiting her son Andrew in California when she passed away unexpectedly in Alameda, California. She is buried at one of two burial locations in Alameda County: _____ and Chapel of Memorials in Oakland, Alameda, California.¹ I have created a FindaGrave profile for her and will update upon discovery of burial location: https://www.findagrave.com/memorial/194154112/ida-jane-weidenbacker

A DETAILED LOOK

Ida Jane (M.) Robinson / Robertson (1872-1921)

I present a look into Ida Robinson's life through a journey of discovery of documents and images. Beginning with her birth, marriage, and death and burial. In the following presentation of images, transcription notes written in BOLD are pre-printed words on forms and documents, usually in a typed or printed manner and easy to read. Hand-written answers will be written in normal font and not in bold. A question mark (?) will appear after words I gave my best guess to and (illeg.) will be written next to words which are illegible. Words appearing in *italic* are my notes pertaining to said image.

IDA JANE ROBINSON/ROBERTSON BORN 1871/72


1871-1872, September or October Ida Robinson is born. According to her death record, her birth was listed as 2 Oct 1872, however all census records she lists Sep 1871 as her birthdate. Her husband Andrew Fullum Weidenbacker was born 2 Oct 1869, so likely this was where the "Oct 2nd" date came from – the informant giving the information confused the dates. I contacted the delayed birth records at Ohio vital records, and they could find no information for Ida being born around that date.

IDA GIVES BIRTH TO FIRST SON, ANDREW EDWARD, IN 1892:

1893, December 22nd (age 21) Ida gives birth to son, Andrew Edward.

IDA GIVES BIRTH TO SECOND SON, JOHN WILLIAM, IN 1895:

1895, July 6th (age 24) Ida gives birth to son, John William (later he goes by the name of Jack). It is shown the residence is "Waverly" which I originally interpreted to mean Waverly, Humphries, Tennessee. However, I have found other documents showing the terms "Waverly Place" and indicating it is in Nashville Ward 23.

#### IDA GIVES BIRTH TO CHILD, UNKNOWN:

1896-1900 (age 24-28) Ida gives birth to an unknown child, who died sometime before the 1900 census was taken. As the family was on the move from Tennessee to Michigan around this time, it is possible there is a birth/death record for this infant in another state (TN > KY > OH > MI).

#### IDA MOVES NORTH WITH FAMILY 1900, FROM TENNESSEE TO MICHIGAN, abt 675 miles

1900, June 5th (age 28) Aida Weidenberger – Saginaw, Saginaw, Michigan, age 28, at 332 Washington, Block C, which appears to be having several families dwelling there separately in units. This census shows Ida (her name is spelled as Aida) having been married for 9 years. It also shows she has had 3 children and 2 are living.
