

#### Dwyer

**Dwyer** is an Irish surname which is a slightly anglicised variation of O'Dwyer. It is said that people with the surname Dwyer and who come from Ireland all come from the same clan.<sup>2</sup>

A little history about the surname of Dwyer. O'Dwyer (Irish: Ó Dubhuir), also known as Dwyer, Dyer or Maguire is one of Ireland's oldest Gaelic noble or aristocratic houses, based most prominently in what is today **County Tipperary**. The name means "dark coloured", in reference to their progenitor Dubhuir mac Spealáin's hair colour. A claimed ancestor of the O'Dwyer clan was King Milesius of Spain, who according to legend conquered Ireland for the Gaels.<sup>3</sup>

#### County Kerry

"Kerry, a county of Ireland, province of Munster, 53 m. long and 41 broad; bounded E by Limerick and Cork, W by the Atlantic, N by the Shannon, which separates it from Thomond, and S by Desmond nd the ocean, containing 1,040,487 acres, divided into 84 parishes. Chief rivers, the Cashing, Lane, Roughy, and Mang. The S is a plain, and fertile in corn; but the greater part is mountainous, chiefly adapted for grazing. Considerable quantities of beef, butter, hides, and tallow, are exported. It sends 4 members to parliament. Pop 205,037. Chief town, Tralee."

On Michael Dwyer's 1841 marriage record, it shows his parents names as "John Dwyer and Cather Fenton of Kerry." It can be assumed Michael Dwyer was likely born in County Kerry following his parents marriage, which would have been between 1798-1810.

The following shows households in Kerry for 1852. We know the Dwyer's lived in Canada at this time, however it does show the concentrated areas and parish names, which can help focus in on areas for other researchers.


John Grenham's Irish Records website shows the Dwyer households<sup>5</sup> in mid-nineteenth century Ireland had the most concentration around these counties:

On the 1841 marriage record for Michael Dwyer, his parentage is listed as "late John Dwyer & Cather Fenton, County Kerry." This puts Michael's birthplace \*probable\* for County Kerry, Ireland.

It is evident, Michael, like many Irish immigrants, didn't know his birth year and often estimated his age when it came to census reports. The 1871 census shows Michael "cannot read or write" thus he likely didn't know when he was baptised and where.

Michael was a farmer for all of his life.




Figure 1: Image of Michael Dwyer: 6

## MICHAEL DWYER, continued, part two

### UPON ARRIVING IN ONTARIO,

#### 1820-1840

Sometime between 1820 and 1840, Michael Dwyer emigrated from Ireland. Did he come with his parents, or was his family caught in the Great Famine, the Irish potato famine, and pass in Ireland thus he came alone? Did he come with other brothers or sisters? Did Michael have a first wife, or any children, or was he in the military during this time?

#### 1822

In 1822, there is a John Dwyer in the neighbouring County of Goulbourn with a land grant. Was this his father, John Dwyer of County Kerry, Ireland? When did he emigrate?

#### Perth and Ramsay Townships, Lanark County, Ontario, Canada (1841-1852)

Michael and Bridget are both shown on their marriage record to be residents of Ramsay Township, Lanark County, Ontario at the time of their marriage in 1841. If Michael was born in 1798, he would have been age 43 at the time of his marriage. This is quite old for a first marriage. It may be likely he was widowed in Ireland from a previous marriage or he was in the military.




Figure 2: Image of Bridget O'Meara:7

#### From the book "The Peter Robinson's Settlers" by Carol Bennett:

"Perth is town located in Drummond Twp – Lanark County –Ontario• Bridget O'Mara to Michael Dwyer - Oct. 5, 1841 According to Carol Bennett's book, Father John MacDonald, the pioneer priest at Perth, married Bridget O'Mara and Michael Dwyer (that's how it was spelled on the marriage record) on Oct. 5, 1841 at St. John the Baptist church in Perth. Their parents are John O'Mara and Johanna Foley; John Dwyer and Catherine Fenton (the latter were not PR Settlers). They are buried behind the church at St. Henry's, Le Sueur County, MN. ...it is entirely possible that the marriage was not performed at Perth, however. Fr. MacDonald was an itinerant missionary priest who often married people in their homes!"










Figure 7: Cover of the book, History of Perth County 1825-1902 by William Johnston:

The following four pages are an excerpt from the book "History of the County of Perth" by William Johnston for which the surname Dwyer is mentioned, and records show it pertains to Michael Dwyer.

WILLIAM JOHNSTON

On page 219, 2<sup>nd</sup> paragraph "Its soil was uniformly so good, that in a period extending from 1841 to 1848, every acre was claimed by owners, lessees, or "squatters."" This could be one of the main reasons they (the Maras, Foleys, and Dwyers) all moved south, was as they were farmers and worked the land – the soil was better here and their farms would flourish. As evidenced by tax assessments, this indeed was the case for Michael Dwyer.

On page 220 2<sup>nd</sup> paragraph beginning "Blanshard was settled almost entirely by people from the north of Ireland, particularly that portion west of the river Thames. East of the river, surrounding St. Marys, Scotch predominated. West of the river, north of Ireland people were immensely in the ascendency. Settlement began almost simultaneously north and south of the Little Falls." and middle "On eight and nine were Rea, Willis, McIntyre, Stafford, Moutray, Sawyer, McDougall, Parker, Dwyer, and Quinn."

On page 221 2<sup>nd</sup> paragraph at bottom it reads "the first patents for land were granted in Blanshard as follows:" (the next page is the relevant concession). On page 222 middle page of the excerpt: "On concession No. 8 to Neil McLennan, on June 20, 1851."

Reading through tax assessment records which also follow, Michael Dwyer took possession of Concession 8 Lot 4 in 1852.

#### CHAPTER XIV.

#### BLANSHARD.

Blanshard township is situated in the centre of a great triangle, formed by the Huron road, Governor's road, and the London and Goderich road, extending from London to Clinton. It received its name in honor of Mr. Blanshard, a director of the Canada Company, and was not surveyed till 1839. This municipality was, therefore, the last to be opened up in the Huron Tract. That it should thus have remained so long did not arise from undesirable conditions in the soil. On the contrary, it contained no swamp, rocky, or waste lands to interfere in any way with pioneer operations. Indeed, it contains, perhaps, a larger block of unbroken surface than can be found elsewhere in this county. Like Hibbert, its backward position arose from circumstances connected with the surveys of surrounding municipalities.

When opened for settlement no township in this county was more rapidly taken up. Its soil was uniformly so good, that in a period extending from 1841 to 1848, every acre was claimed by owners, lessees, or "squatters." A contiguity of pioneers to each other in a new country has a marked effect in its progress. Where swamps exist, or land is broken by rock, sand, or other obstacles to retard operations of the woodman, settlers become isolated from each other. This condition renders road making and building of schools and houses too heavy a task to those few so sparsely located on suitable intervening lands. No such obstructions affected this township. Blanshard had no difficulties extraneous to those inseparable from life in the woods under favourable conditions. Progress was, therefore, rapid, extending in a very short

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time to every section. It is also noticeable in a new country that advancement is largely dependent on the character of those by whom it is settled. Indeed, this is of greater consequence to development than extreme fertility of soil. This county was most fortunate in being located by people of British origin and Germans. A better class of bushmen could not be obtained from any other nationalities, and results afford ample evidence of this fact.

Blanshard was settled almost entirely by people from the north of Ireland, particularly that portion west of the river Thames. East of the river, surrounding St. Marys, Scotch predominated. West of the river, north of Ireland people were immensely in the ascendency. Settlement began almost simultaneously north and south of the Little Falls. The McGregor family, Legg, Mackintosh, Forrester, Weir, Delmage, Sinclair, and Jickling were pioneers. Southward were Bradly, Pickard, McVannel, Weston, Tasker, and Hutchings. Extending north and south on the Mitchell road were Christie, Henderson, Doupe, Switzer, Sparling, Armstrong, McKinnett, Cameron, Carrol, Rea, Warren, Sansburn, Bell, Draper, Willis, and Hayes. On concession one were Bell, Meighen, Irvine, Robertson, and Gowan. On two and three were Cameron, Dickinson, McCullough, McCallum, Anderson, Switzer, Beatty, and Sparling. On four and five were Spearin, Shier, Kennedy, Irvine, Berry, Robinson, Hazlewood, and Burns. On six and seven, Benner, Marriott, Cathcart, Creighton, Paynter, Chappell, Riordan, Morrill, Murphy, and Miller. On eight and nine were Rea, Willis, McIntyre, Stafford, Moutray, Sawyer, McDougall, Parker, Dwyer, and Quinn. On ten and eleven were Somerville, Slack, Crawford, Dinsmore, Shipley, McDonald, Styles, Gilpin, and Hopkins. On twelve were Hayes, Byfield, Radcliff, Crawford, Foster, Gunning, and Morley. By far the greatest number of these were north of Ireland people, and apparently drawn from the better class. Many were characterized by intelligence, high sense of honour, and an air of refinement much in advance of those coming from a land where education could scarcely be obtained. They were intensely loyal to their country, and proud of its achievements by land and

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sea. In those feelings were hid the elements of success. people who have no pride in former historical records of their country are in the first stage of national decay. An individual who has no pride in his family or ancestoral honour has lost the highest incentive to honour in himself, and is on the verge of moral decrepitude. Between 1841 and 1848 the whole township may be said to have been "taken up." During that period, however, comparatively little of it had been patented or "deeded." In fact, as late as 1850 very few titles had been granted in Blanshard. According to the system adopted by the Canada Company in disposing of their lands first by leasehold tenure, it was not till these agreements had expired that a settler applied for his patent. As these indentures covered a period of ten years, all those issued between 1841 and 1848 expired between 1851 and 1858. In this interval, therefore, a large portion of land was patented. In cases where a settler was unable to secure his deed another lease was granted at a slightly increased price, if desired, by adding 21/2 per cent. to the original cost. A number adopted this plan of holding their land rather than borrow money to pay for it. At the same time we regret to say that names appear in many of our first title deeds of men who never endured the hardships of pioneer life. Recourse was had to mortgaging for securing their patents by quite a number, at rates of interest from 15 to 25 per cent. per annum. At such prices for money it is not surprising that very few were ever able to redeem themselves. While this occurred in too many instances, it is gratifying to know that a large number were able to discharge all their obligations from their own earnings, and obtain that much coveted, long hoped for, and hard earned piece of parchment, on which were written the magic words "the said lands to have and to hold to him and his heirs for ever."

The Canada Company's records in Toronto show that the first patents for land were granted in Blanshard, as follows:—On concession No. 1 to Gordon Meighen, November 27, 1844, and three days later another on the same concession was granted to William Beatty. On concession No. 2, Donald Cameron, on

Sept. 25th, 1843. On concession No. 3, to Archie McCallum, on October the 7th, 1844. On concession No. 4, to Adam Shier, on June 18, 1844. On concession No. 5, to Gerard Irvine, on Sept. 13, 1846. On concession No. 6, to Alexander Jamieson, on Oct. 3, 1846. On concession No. 7, to David Smith, on August 6, 1846. On concession No. 8 to Neil McLennan, on June 20, 1851. On concession No. 10, to Thomas Dinsmore, on February 26, 1853. On concession No. 11, to Samuel Radcliffe, on February 26, 1847. On concession No. 12, to Peter Watson, on December 27, 1849. On concession No. 13, to Thomas Christie, on March 5, 1844. On concession No. 14, to Thomas Skinner, on August 6, 1853. On concession No. 15, to William Fleetford, on November 1, 1842. This patent granted to William Fleetford appears to be the first issued in the township of Blanshard, and was for lot 15, on concession 15. On concession No. 17, to Adam St. John, on July 18, 1848. On concession No. 18, to Walter Stinson, on May 12, 1848. On concession No. 19, to Robert Patterson, on May 20, 1845. On concession No. 20, to Caleb Richardson, on September, 1848. On the north boundery concession, to Edward Delmage, 1848. On the south boundary concession, to George Jackson, on December 22, 1848. On the east Mitchell road concession, to John Sparling, on June 8, 1844. On the west Mitchell road concession, to Donald Cameron, on August 6, 1845. On the west boundary concession, to Jasper Ward, on August 27, 1852. On the Thames concession to Thomas Ingersoll, on February 19, 1844. To James Ingersoll, on August 13, 1849, was granted a patent for an island below the falls, in the river Thames, containing one acre and seven perches, and for which he is to pay therefor the sum of five shillings. On the 6th day of August, 1845, a patent was granted to the Rev. Ephraim Evans, of London, for part of lot No. 22, concession No. 8, for a place of interment. This grant was made to Mr. Evans, who applied on behalf of the settlers in the district for a plot to bury their dead, and was made by the Canada Company without any consideration.

From the time the first settler erected his solitary shanty by the River Thames, in 1841, every day brought some new adventure to the municipality.

Michael Dwyer is shown on Tax Assessments for Blanshard, Perth, Ontario from 1852-1872 for 100 acres at Concession 8 Lot 4:

For 20 years, the Dwyer family lived in Blanshard, specifically at Concession 8 Lot 4 on a 100 acre farm just SE of Woodham:<sup>10</sup>



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

This also shows they own 2 female dogs and the family is Roman Catholic in religion. Statute Labour shows he has worked 5 days.

"One of the first Acts of Parliament of Upper Canada, in 1793, was the introduction of Statute Labour. This law was essentially a tax that required male landowners to perform road maintenance in lieu of cash, which was hard to come by in the new Province." <sup>12</sup>



### UPON ARRIVING IN THE UNITED STATES FROM CANADA, the


Dwyer family would have travelled around 855 miles, or a nearly 14-hour car drive by today's standards. However, this was the late 1800s. This was likely by horse and carriage, or by train, or pullman car, or any variation thereof. The family would have profited quite well from their farm as evidenced by the previous tax assessments, so this type of travel would have been easy to pay for.

By train, they would pass briefly through the remainder of Ontario as they passed the border into Michigan, skirting around Lake Michigan to Chicago. From Chicago, they would have gone north, into Wisconsin and then finally through Minneapolis, Minnesota and down to Cleveland to the southwest. As the weather around the great lakes can be quite formidable, I estimate they emigrated in the summertime.


The train which would have taken them west was known as the Grand Trunk Railway, the predecessor to the Canadian National Railway. Grand Trunk Railway (GTR) was built in 1850 between Montreal and Toronto. By the 1860s, it was on both sides of the Canada-US border and heading west. This was the time the Dwyer family emigrated in 1872. Railway trivia: By 1899, the GTR had become the CNR, Canadian Northern Railway, and by 1919 it was Canadian National Railway.

By 1884, the GTR had only reached Chicago. It is likely the Dwyer family might have taken a "Through Pullman Car" for the rest of the travel to Minnesota, or what would be a sleeper coach car a smaller train. The "Through Pullman Cars" left out of Chicago to connect with other lines.




## THOMAS DWYER (DEWIRE), Michael's son

Thomas lived with his parents and traveled with them from Ramsay township in Lanark County to Blanshard, Perth County, Ontario. He emigrated in 1868 from Canada to US, and his first papers are 8 Mar 1869 in Le Sueur County, Minnesota.

He married 1. Catherine Reynolds 20 Nov 1872 and was widowed. He then married 2. Mary Cavanagh 13 May 1879. He and Mary lived in Saint Henry in 1880 and then Lexington, Le Sueur County until 1920, where he moved to LeSueur Center for the last 8 years until his death in 1928 (source: his obit). He and his second wife died only 2 days apart and had a double funeral. They lived at Lot \_\_\_\_ Concession \_\_\_\_ 34 while in Lexington. His name is spelled as Thos. Dewire on several plat maps.







Double Funeral For Pioneer Couple Held Here Saturday

Mr. And Mrs. Thomas Dewire Passed Away Few Hours Of Each Other Last Week.

It is not frequent indeed that double funeral services for a man and wife are conducted, especially when their passing was due to advanced age and natural causes, but that was the case at St. Mary's church here last Saturday morning, April 28th, when Rev Father Woods conducted the last rites for Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Dewire, pioneer residents of the county and this section, who passed away within a few hours of each other. A large number of old friends and acquaintances were present to pay their last respects to the estimable couple. Interment was in Calvary Cemetery here. Mr. Dewire, note of whose illness was made previous issue, passed away at six o'clock Wednesday evening of last week, April 25th, and his estimable wife, who had also been ill for sometime, followed him in death on Friday morning, April 27th, at 8 o'clock, or within thirty-eight hours. Thomas Dewire was born in Ontario, Canada, Nov. 19, 1854, and was 83 years old. With others from his section, he came to this locality in 1868 and located in Lexington township, where he farmed up until eight years ago when he and Mrs. Dewire moved to LeSueur Center to reside. Mr. Dewire was twice marries, his first wife being Catherine Reynolds, who passed away many years ago. They were married at St. Peter. Two children survive from this marriage, John W. Dewire and Mrs. Jas. P. Murray, of this village. His second wife, and who passed with him, was Mary Kavanaugh, to whom he was married at St. Henry in 1879. She was also born in Canada and to thi country with her family in 1878. Brothers of Mr. Dewire living are: Peter Dewire, Sr., of Dent, Minn., and John Dewire, west of LeSueur Center. Brothers and sisters of Mrs. Dewire are: Jerry Kavanaugh, Washington; Dan, of Duluth, Minn.; Peter, of Nevis, Minn.; John, Deer Creek Minn,; Joseph, Shevlin, Minn,; Mrs. Annie Reger, Page N.D.; Mrs. Catherine Owens, Missoula, Mont. There are nine grandchildren. One grandson, Walter Hankins, was killed in action in France during the World War. Mr. Dewire, as we knew him and as all his many friends knew him, was a man of excellent character and disposition, and one who attended to his own affairs in a quiet way and ever willing to do his full share. He was one of gentlemanly dignity entirely becoming of him who ever had a pleasant word to say to old friends. His estimable wife was one of the same characteristics and they were very much attached to each other through their long life. They were both active and much interested in church progress and affairs. Mr. Dewire was one of the organizers of the local St. Mary's parish. In the passing of these estimable pioneers, a personal loss is felt, for they were both long time and faithful friends of the local newspaper and its publisher. 


